Places to Play: BROOKWOOD PARK

If you follow the paved trail system from South Riverside Park to the East you'll find a pleasant grove, studded with beautiful mature trees nestled along the Cedar River. Brookwood Park is located just Southeast of the old Green Bridge. The park features walking trails, open green space, a non-motorized boat ramp, and the City's only Disc Golf Course. Due to its convenient river access, Brookwood Park makes a fantastic fishing spot.

Today only one house remains. There is currently no shelter or playground equipment in the park due to the low river bank.

However, the beauty and serenity of the park make it a perfect spot to sit and enjoy nature and will surely be a place to do so for years to come.
