**Fantasy** is a genre that uses magic and other supernatural forms as a primary element of plot, theme, and/or setting. Fantasy is generally distinguished from science fiction by the expectation that it steers clear of technological and macabre themes, respectively, though there is a great deal of overlap between the three collectively known as speculative fiction. In its broadest sense, fantasy comprises works by many writers, artists, filmmakers, and musicians, from ancient myths and legends to many recent works embraced by a wide audience today, including young adults.

### Some good fantasy titles include:

*The Book of Life* by Deborah Harkness, *The Queen of the Tearling* by Erika Johansen, *The Lord of the Rings trilogy* by J. R. R. Tolkein, *Outlander series* by Diana Gabaldon.

### Vs.

**Paranormal** books involve unusual experiences that lack a scientific explanation. Some popular subjects in paranormal books are supernatural creatures, ESP, clairvoyance, ghosts, UFOs, telepathy, and psychics. A subgenre of paranormal books and of romances is <u>paranormal romance</u>. These books focus mainly on the romantic relationships with a background theme of vampires, shapeshifters, ghosts, time travel, fantastical beings, and psychic abilities.

Some good Paranormal titles include:

Sinner by Maggie Stiefvater, Silver Shadows by Richelle Mead, Born of Fury by Sherrilyn Kenyon, Anita Blake series by Laurell K. Hamilton, Fever series by Karen Marie Moning.

These two genres tend to crossover and many books include several elements of both, creating sub-genres...These are some of my favorite books to read
