Monday, November 14 & 28 at 7 PM

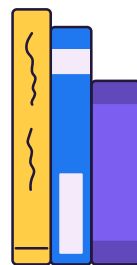

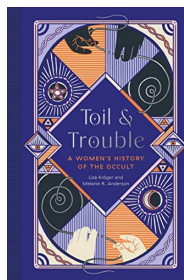
5TH TUESDAY CRAFT
